The Desert Gold Diggers fall overnight outing is October 6-8 (Friday-Sunday) at the campsite located on E. Fish Canyon Road. Directions are provided on the map on the following page and there is plenty of room for tents, trailers, and RVs. Please check the local weather forecast prior to the event and plan accordingly for weather conditions.

Events at the outing will include:

- Crockpot cook-off and an outdoor movie (Friday evening, October 6).
- Metal detector hunt (Saturday morning October 7) at 8:00 AM. The detector hunt will consist of 50 buried targets for prizes of gold nuggets, \$2 bills, and dollar coins.

## The Gregory School "Oregon Trail Adventure"

On Wednesday, September 19, several DGD board members participated in the Oregon Trail Adventure event at the Gregory School. The DGD members provided 24 5th-graders with information on gold prospecting and the different types of prospecting equipment used by settlers back in the late 1800s.

Ralph Montano shared some gold history with the students, discussed different prospecting techniques, and then demonstrated how to pan for gold. Ed Madson showed the students gold specimens including a 1.1 ounce gold nugget.

Students went to 12 panning stations set up by the DGD members and each student selected a zip-lock bag containing sand mixed with a small amount of gold. The students started panning the pay dirt with the assistance of the DGD members, and it did not take long before excited students began to shout "I found gold!"

It was an incredible day. Not only did the students and faculty have a great time, but it was very rewarding for all DGD participants to see the beaming faces, the excitement, and the appreciation expressed by the students and faculty.

Every student left with a small vial of gold and there is no doubt that the Gregory School 5th-graders now have gold fever!
